

Week One: Handout

Introduction to the Bible Study, and a few simple guidelines

- 1. This is a study of the Bible, not of a particular denomination's beliefs.
- 2. No one is trying to prove anyone right or wrong
- 3. Lesson length will vary, but I am a firm believer that "the mind can only endure what the seat can handle."
- 4. This first lesson will probably be the longest of all of them because I want to take a little time to establish the Word of God as authoritative. I mean... if we are going to say our time together is a "study of the Bible"... then we should make sure the Bible is a book that we can actually trust! For planning purposes, know that each lesson will be no less than 25 minutes and no more than 45 minutes.
- 5. Most importantly: That we would open our hearts and minds as we open up the Word of God!

- 1. All scripture is given by inspiration of God (2 Timothy 3:16–17)
- 2. Thy word is a lamp unto my feet (Psalm 119:105)

- 1. Ye shall not add unto the word (**Deuteronomy 4:2, Proverbs 30:6, Revelation 22: 18-19**)
- 2. One Baptism (Ephesians 4:4-5)

- 3. Internal declarations (John 5:46-47, Luke 24:44)
- 4. External Evidence (Matthew 19:4-5, Matthew 24:37-39)
- 5. Internal Evidence (Matthew 22:32, John 6:49, Matthew 12:40-41)

1. God has always chosen humankind (Hebrews 11:6, Isaiah 55:8-9)
