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## WHAT IS "WE CARE"

Wecare Ministries exemplifies Refuge Church's commitment to sharing the hope of Jesus through tangible actions, guided by the Spirit of God and manifesting the fruit of the Spirit as seeds sown into the community. Additionally, it strives to embody Jesus' parable, encouraging disciples to illuminate the gospel through their deeds, bringing glory to God and guiding others toward Him (cf. Matthew 5:14-16). The ministry also seeks to establish a welcoming "front porch (cf. Acts 5:12; Solomon's porch)" for those outside the kingdom, inviting them in through inclusion, invitation, and discipleship.



## HOW DO "WE CARE"

We follow the example of Jesus in both feeling and action. Mark 6:34 says, "When [Jesus] went ashore he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. And he began to teach them many things." Not shortly after Jesus performed a miracle by feeding over five thousands people. With physical essentials satisfied, there was now appropriate space for spiritual appetite.

**We Care** by compassionately meeting needs while simultaneously remaining goal-oriented to the discipleship process. WeCare can become an onboarding process that starts the growth tract at Refuge.



#### WHY DO "WE CARE"

It's easy to assume that Jesus was only interested in our "soul", but that's not entirely true. Jesus cared for the entirety of a person - body, mind, heart, spirit and soul. He was concerned with every aspect of humanity, and that's why we should **care** for every part of a person's journey (emotionally, mentally, spiritually and physically) as they walk toward Christ and eventually walk with Him.



## WHO DO "WE CARE" FOR?

Everyone. Every Culture. Creed. Gender. Race. Age. Nationality. Ethnicity. Religion. Occupation.

A caveat to this will be at times we focus narrowly and purposefully to certain subgroups (i.e., single mothers, the unhoused, abused, economically challenged, the minority, those struggling with addiction etc.)

In all sincerity, our impact is widespread, yet we maintain a laser focus on our two campus locations (Excelsior, Independence, and the surrounding areas). Our commitment is unwavering, as we never turn anyone away but remain strategic in our mission to care (cf. Acts 6:1-7).

CarePortal functions as an organizational system enabling churches to address the needs of children within the school system. When a child requires assistance, the social worker communicates their essential needs through a detailed narrative on a systematic platform, forming a request. This request is then transmitted to registered churches in the county. Subsequently, we respond based on our available time, talents, and resources to meet the identified needs.

Accept requests and mobilizes team and volunteers to dedicated times, spaces and locations to meet the needs of community.




#### **CAREPORTAL TEAM**
